Mid-Winter Board Meeting

On Saturday, January 28, the board of directors met at the Bruce & Ethel Smith homestead in Jacobus. Ten members were present, one attended via teleconference and six were absent.

President Rev. Tom Shelley opened the meeting with a prayer and a special thought to remember deceased past director Richard Glatfelter from East Petersburg, Pa. (More on Richard in the President's Message.)

Judy Martin reported for the Executive Committee, which met earlier in January and discussed mostly the budget and committees. The list of committees appears later in the newsletter.

An email from Philip Glatfelter for the Brick Patio Committee brought to the board's attention a possible safeguard for the preservation of the bricks in the form of a sealant. Certain conditions at the park have discolored some of the bricks and Phil had already bought a liquid that should wash what is supposedly mold off those bricks. Glen-Gery Corp., our brick supplier, suggested a sealant which costs \$35 a gallon. After some discussion, the board decided to have Phil purchase the liquid.

For the Communications Committee, Larry Gladfelter Jr. sent an email noting the number of names on the email list has increased from 200 in 2010 to about 300 at present. The email notification regarding the posting of the newsletter on the website has been very successful, especially the amount of postage saved.

Bryan Miller, reporting for the Property Committee, said that the new gate at the driveway to Heimwald Park has been working out well, and that the next big project is to fix the driveway. Stones are needed along with a pathway for drainage. Drainage from the area around the springhouse down through the park will also be investigated.

Miller also reported on the Education Fund and noted that he has been receiving scholarship applications.

President's Message

During my years of service to our organization on the Board, I have been privileged to work with many fine directors. All have brought interests, talents and skills that have combined with those brought by their fellow directors to serve the good of all.

Many brought a gift of vision: an ability to see beyond the present moment. Since we are largely an historically-focused organization, it is natural that much of our vision would be turned backward, drawing on our past to inform our present.

Less common has been the gift of forward vision, of drawing on our past not only to inform our present, but also to shape and expand our future.

Director Emeritus Richard I. Glatfelter ("Richard the Barber" or "Richard of East Petersburg", as he was often called in Board discussions so as to distinguish him from Rev. J. Richard of Lancaster) frequently articulated a vision that Heimwald Park could and should be used for more than a Sunday afternoon reunion.

"This just isn't good stewardship" he would say.

And he was right. It was not good stewardship to spend thousands of dollars annually in taxes and insurance to maintain a "place or grove in which reunions may be held from time to time" for just a single day.

His persistence led to the establishment of the Saturday picnic, which, in its early years, was underwritten by his personal financial support. That support has been assumed by George and Susan Glatfelter in recent years, and for that support we remain most grateful. Indeed, could we imagine a reunion weekend without the picnic?

Richard "of East Petersburg" would have been most pleased with the other uses of Heimwald in 2011. Several local scout troops had a campout in May, during which time they repainted the "Familyhaus" or refreshment stand as it is variously known. And in late September, a family which had rented the park for its own reunion decades ago received permission from the directors to rent Heimwald Park once again.

It is fitting that these expanded uses occurred during Richard the Barber's final year of life. Richard departed this world on Nov. 20 ... vision realized, mission accomplished. "Well done, good and faithful servant."

Financial Page

In 2011, we were very fortunate that our investments had earnings that were \$778 above the 2010 earnings. The majority of these investments are from the Endowment Fund. This income helps to support the general expenses of Heimwald Park. Our Endowment Fund now stands at \$74,985.

While general contributions decreased by about \$1,300, the sale of DVDs and proceeds from other merchandise sales more than made up for that in 2011. We owe a great debt of gratitude to Larry Gladfelter Sr. and Larry Gladfelter Jr. for their work in creating, duplicating and fulfilling orders for the two DVDs that they created from their trip to Glattfelden, Switzerland, and from the 107th annual reunion in 2011. They have very generously donated all proceeds from the sale of these DVDs to the Association.

Our one significant cost last year was the installation of a steel gate on the entrance driveway into the park. The total cost for this project was \$2,697, and is included in Park Maintenance. Other expenses were within budget.

Due to our overall favorable financial experience last year, we realized a net gain of \$3,306 in the General Fund, which stands at \$29,701.
