

The Expanded Brick Patio

The brick patio was expanded and redesigned in 2007 so that the engraved bricks read like a descendancy chart. The result is that nearly every brick has been moved to a new location on the patio.

Bricks in both the old (east side of pavilion) and the new (north side) sections of the patio are now arranged so that each row (or course) of bricks is used for a particular generation. The first row is for Casper, his wives, and his brother. The second row is for the second generation – Casper's sons and their wives, and so on. After the fourth row, a generation may be represented in more than one row. The patio has ten labeled generations with space for more. Most bricks have been placed according to this pattern.

In the old patio are the descendants of Solomon and Felix. In the new patio are descendants of John, Henry, Michael and Casper the younger. Bricks for Casper's brother, John Peter, and for friends of the Association are there also.
